Council News: These past months, over 30 people met with Carol Gabanna on three Saturday mornings to consider our congregation's governance structure. Some elements that were discussed as important in the governance of Trinity-Clifton were: accountability, transparency, creativity, flexibility, being nimble with decision making, strong leadership, simplified process, doable, connected with

congregation, open lines of communication and a workable-size Council. To this end, at the June 6th Council meeting, two motions were brought by the Nominating Committee to support the ongoing work on our congregation's governance structure:

- 1. That Gail MacNutt and Bob MacNutt, along with anyone who attended the final session with Carol Gabanna and who would like to join them, be authorized to set up a timeline to move forward with the governance review. Approved.
- 2. That Amy Ramsay and Barbara Prowse and from 1-3 additional people who attended the final session with Carol Gabanna who may wish to join them be authorized to continue the necessary work on the governance model as presented by Carol Gabanna. Approved. Please expect an update on this ongoing work early in September. We are excited about the possibilities that are before us and are hoping to have a new and improved governance ready to be approved at the Annual Meeting in February 2020. To help celebrate the DiverseCity Multicultural Festival on Sun., June 23, Trinity United Church will theme our weekly Sunday worship service: "Healing our Beautiful and Broken World Together". We will welcome the Mi'kmaq Heritage Actors; special music by soloist, Samel Sunil; and a message from Dr. Sobia Ali-Faisal, from the Faculty of Psychology at the University of PEI. A special blessing/dedication of a unique parament, created for our sanctuary, will also be included.
